





FACTS ABOUT CANADA-POLAND RELATIONS

- Canada and Poland enjoy excellent political, social and commercial relations with expanding military cooperation and growing academic cultural ties.
- Canada was the first country to ratify the Accession Protocols for Polish accession to the North Atlantic Organization (NATO).
- Poland is Canada's largest market in Central and Eastern Europe, with bilateral merchandise trade reaching over \$1.9 billion in 2014 - \$346 million in Canadian exports and \$1.6 billion in Canadian imports.
- Business on both sides of the Atlantic benefit from provisions in the Canada-European Union Trade Agreement (CETA), ratified in 2017.
- CETA will significantly improve market access for services and investment. Canada's Market Access Plan (MAP), a three-year plan under Canada's Global Markets Action Plan, for Poland will help Canadian business benefit even further from those opportunities.

Excellence Awards by Canada-Poland Chamber of Commerce

Canada-Poland Chamber of Commerce Excellence Awards has an aim to recognize business people outstanding in their field by their peers for their commitment to organizational excellence. By awarding those organizations and most committed to economic progress, both for themselves and for the Canadian market as a whole, we all take a more prominent position and gain greater influence in trade between Canada and Poland or strengthening the image of the Polish Business community in Canada.

Nomination Process:

Canada-Poland Chamber of Commerce accepts self-nominations and nominations by members or non-members. This year, the Excellence Awards Nominating Committee was made up of the Board of Directors of Canada-Poland Chamber of Commerce. Prior to the final nomination each nominee is contacted to obtain the nominee's interest in receiving the award and participating in our annual Excellence Awards Gala.

Submission Rules

- 1. Judging for this award is based solely on the information provided by the nominee.
- 2. The nominee of Polish descent doesn't have to be a Chamber member.
- 3. To be considered for an award the nominee not of Polish descent has to be a Chamber member.
- 4. Businesses and Individuals cannot be nominated in multiple categories. MUST only select 1 category to put forth for a submission.
- 5. Past recipients are eligible to be re-nominated the next year in a different category.
- 6. One can be re-nominated for the same category only after at least 3 years have passed from the initial nomination.

Evaluation Process

- 1. Board members will receive summaries of the nominations prior to their determinations.
- 2. The judging panel will take into consideration additional factors:
 - a/ Leadership
 - b/ Professionalism
 - c/ Social Involvement
 - d/ Innovation
 - e/ Activity in Chamber Initiatives
- 3. If there are two individuals/companies that stand out equally and a decision cannot be reached by the Judges, the Chair and Vice President Membership of the Canada-Poland Chamber of Commerce will jointly make a final decision.
- 4. The Judges' decisions are final. Details of the Judges' panel meetings will not be disclosed, and all entries will be treated as strictly confidential. Only details of the award winners in each category will be published.



Rising Star of the Year 2023




